Introduction

PRINCE2®¹ (Projects IN Controlled Environments, Version2) is a structured method for effective project management. Developed by the UK Government, the PRINCE2® method is internationally accepted as the leading “best practice” project management approach and is widely used in the private and public sectors, both in the UK and internationally.

The course covers the 2009 version and provides delegates with a solid grounding in the techniques, processes and tools of PRINCE2® and Project Management methodology.

Extensive use is made of case study material which is designed to help delegates consolidate the elements of the PRINCE2® Foundation part of the course, produce the key PRINCE2® management products, discuss PRINCE2® scalability issues and apply the elements of PRINCE2® to a practical scenario as they will be expected to do so in the Practitioner examination.
